The current building owner, a Manhattan family who previously occupied the building as Ginsburg & Levy Antiques, Inc., renovated the property for commercial use in 1926. They used the building until 1983, when Giorgio Armani created their first flagship Madison Avenue location.

Both of these Italian firms are placing their bet and confidence in Manhattan, and Madison Avenue especially, which is a very logical move. We sold 718 Madison Avenue just down the street from here and Beretta USA, the new owner, can't get over how high their sales
