"Back In The Day, I Was An Associate"

When I walked out of 400 Park Avenue one day back in 1998, I had a great gut feeling about the place. In addition to having only been in the city a couple of times and finding Park Avenue awe-inspiring, I had just met with Robert Knakal, Paul Massey and Larry Norman at Massey Knakal Realty Services. I was interviewing for an associate position during my senior year of college. When I accepted the job, I thought I could take a month long cross country trip before I started. Bob had something else in mind - my starting a week after graduation. He had said there was a lot to do, and he was right! We had about 25 people total and less than 10 salespeople back then, and we were only in Manhattan. I started as a junior associate with Mike DeCheser. His cousin, Peter, was transitioning to be a broker downtown. Bob was busy as ever working on more than 20 listings at the time. I was doing everything from stuffing mail to making brochures to doing tours. Eventually I was preparing OVs and making calls. I sometimes tell my associates now that we didn't have any help with mailers back in the day. I remember many long nights stuffing mail - I also walked both ways to work uphill in the snow! One St. Patrick's Day, Mike and I were at the office until midnight making 100 marketing books the size of phone books. This

hard work was always rewarded with many great nights on the town with Bob at the Four Seasons, Bruno's or Angelo's. There were a lot of laughs along the way. I don't think I fully realized it at the time, but Bob taught me the business and gave me the platform to run my operations today. By sitting next to him, I was absorbing all the things he did that made him successful. One of the things I noticed early on was that Bob was ALWAYS on the phone. He also always said, "You needed to have a lot of irons in the fire." Today, I always try to have my ear to the phone between 9-5. I also try to have as many listings as possible, because you never know which ones will sell and which ones might lead to another sale. If I could give any advice to the associates, it would be to listen and watch those around you. Listen to experienced agents who are successful. See what they are doing and try to mirror them. Ask them questions. Because we have a territory system, agents will not see you as future competition but rather, as future team members. They are glad to help. By having a position here, it gives everyone the opportunity to move up the ladder. In all, I've been very thankful for the opportunities I've been given.
